

# **Grade 8/9 Investigative Options 2023-2024**

### **Quarter 1 Period 8**

Course: Beginner Acoustic Guitar

**Teacher:** Chris Hartman

**Description:** This is a beginner guitar course perfect for the student who has never picked up the guitar but has always wanted to give it a try. Our main focus will be the acoustic guitar. You will be able to learn and practice the technical skills you need to make acoustic guitar playing enjoyable. You will also have the opportunity to increase your library of popular music, as you will be using the skills you learn to play various pop/rock/country/folk tunes.
