Course: Art of Creativity

Teacher: Winston Day Chief

Description: The Art of Creativity is an immersive class designed to dive deep into the creative process, exploring various techniques and activities that spark imagination and innovation. Through hands-on activities and a look at the creative process, students will learn how to harness their creativity. Whether you are looking to enhance your creativity or you feel you need to learn to be creative this class is for you.

Course: Band

Description: This option is for all students who would like to learn how to play a traditional band instrument and play in an ensemble. Playing in a school band continues to be a great way to grow as a musician and to become part of a unique group of friends who support each other as you work together to make music. This is a developmental option offered during investigative option time. Once you sign up for this band class, please note that you are committing to an entire semester. This is because this option requires time and dedication in terms of consistent practice. Learning an instrument is a skill that you can take with you and enjoy all the way through grade 12 and beyond.

Course: Basic Life Skills
