#### **Options - Developmental and Investigative**

All students had the opportunity to complete a Developmental Options pick sheet and return them to the office in June. Students will select their Investigative Options in the first week of school in September.

#### Lockers

Each student will be assigned a locker and a lock. Students must use the lock provided by the school.



#### **Transportation**

Transportation Registration forms for 2025-2026 have been emailed to eligible families. These forms must be completed by June 30, 2025 to ensure transportation for September for your student. There will be no charge for transportation for 2025-2026 but **you must register your student before June 30**. If you did not receive an emailed form and feel your student is eligible for bussing or if you have any questions, please contact Mrs McPherson in the office at 403-327-3402. Maps/schedules will be posted on the Southland website mid to late August. Parents are to check the maps for their school and find the one that is in their neighborhood. #### Canteen

The canteen offers regular menu items including hamburgers, chicken burgers & wraps, pizza subs, hot dogs, nachos, muffins, cookies, chips and various beverages. There are also exciting daily specials such as cheezy garlic fingers on Monday, mini pizza on Tuesday, etc. The daily special menus are posted in the announcements each day.

Payment can be by cash, debit tap or, the easiest method is to buy prepaid canteen cards through <u>School Cash Online</u>. Canteen cards can be purchased in increments of \$20.50. Your student can then purchase items at the canteen by just telling the canteen staff their name and that they have money on their card. The canteen staff will keep track of your student's spending and will let them know when funds are getting low.

#### **School Fees**

Holy Spirit School Division uses <u>School Cash Online</u> for the payment of all school items such as school fees, option fees, canteen cards, club/athletic fees and spirit wear.



If you have already registered for School Cash Online at another school in the Holy Spirit School Division, you will see the 2025-2026 St. Francis school fees in September. If you are new to Holy Spirit, you will need your student's ASN to register which can be found in PowerSchool.

If you prefer to pay by cash or cheque you can always do so by coming into the office. (Credit and debit cards are no longer accepted.)

#### **Wildcat Athletics News**

The co-curricular athletic year at St. Francis will start with cross country and volleyball and will continue with basketball (November), badminton (March) and track & field (May). # NEW CELL PHONE POLICY 2025-2026

Beginning next school year, St. Francis Junior High will implement a **phone-free policy** for all students during the school day. Students will be required to keep their phones and other personal electronic devices **stored in their lockers from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.**, and are not allowed to access them at any point during the day.



#### St. Francis Junior High School Is Going Phone-Free in 2025–2026

Beginning next school year, St. Francis Junior High will implement a phone-free policy for all students during the school day. Students will be required to keep their phones and other personal electronic devices stored in their lockers from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., including during breaks and lunch.

This decision is grounded in compelling research and a growing concern about the impact of phones on student mental health, academic performance, and social development. We are committed to providing the best possible environment for your child to learn, grow, and connect.

#### Why a Phone-Free Policy?

Over the past decade, schools have experienced a significant rise in issues related to device use during the school day. Research, including Jonathan Haidt's *The Anxious Generation*, identifies several key concerns:

- Brain Development: Adolescent brains are still forming critical executive functions. The constant feedback loops of phones and social media interrupt that growth.
- *Mental Health*: Youth anxiety, depression, and self-harm rates have risen significantly since phones became commonplace in schools. Online comparison and digital dependence are major contributors.
- Academic Disruption: Even when not in use, phones lower attention and retention. Device-free environments lead to improved participation, comprehension, and academic performance.
- Social Disconnection: Students are increasingly isolating themselves with their phones during lunch and breaks. Removing phones allows for stronger face-to-face interaction and peer relationships.

Schools that have already gone phone-free report fewer discipline issues, better attendance, more engaged classrooms, and increased student well-being.

#### What Does "Phone-Free" Mean?

To make the policy clear and consistent, the following devices are not permitted on students during the school day:

- Cell phones (including both smartphones and basic phones)
- AirPods, earbuds, and Bluetooth headphones
- Smartwatches, fitness trackers, or similar connected accessories

These items often continue to disrupt learning and social engagement even when phones are stored away.

All devices must be turned off and stored in lockers. Devices kept in clothing or backpacks will be considered in violation of the policy.

#### **Consequences and Enforcement**

Our goal is not to punish, but to give students the opportunity to be fully present and engaged. However, consistent enforcement is key to the policy's success.

If a student violates the policy:

- 1st Offence: The device will be taken to the office and can be picked up by the student at the end of the day. The incident will be logged.
- 2nd Offence: The device must be picked up by a parent or guardian.
- 3rd Offence: A meeting will be scheduled with the family to create a support plan for the remainder of the school year.

There will be no verbal warnings before consequences are applied. All staff will enforce the policy consistently from the first bell to the last.

#### **Exceptions**

Medical exceptions will be granted only with documentation from a licensed healthcare professional. These must be pre-approved and are limited to the specific medical need for which they are intended. No other phone use is permitted under this exception.

#### **Parent Concerns**

We understand that this change may feel difficult at first, especially for parents who are used to being able to contact their child throughout the day. However, this policy supports students in becoming more independent, confident, and resilient. Most students adapt more quickly than expected.

To help you and your child with this transition, try discussing a few common school-day situations at home, such as forgotten items or changes in plans, and brainstorming together how to handle them without relying on a phone. Encourage your child to use available resources and problem-solve. These are great learning opportunities and can have a big impact on your child's growth.

#### Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

What if I need to contact my child?

Please call the school office. We will ensure your child receives the message.

What if my child needs to contact me?
Students can request to use the school phone at the office.

What about emergencies like lockdowns?

Phones can interfere with emergency protocols by spreading misinformation and disrupting communication. Our trained staff will ensure student safety and communication through official channels.

What if my child has a medical condition that requires them to use a phone? A medical exception may be granted upon submission of documentation. Use will be restricted to that purpose only.

Why not just ban phones during class, but allow them at lunch? Social development is just as important as academics. Phone-free lunches encourage meaningful peer interaction and community building. In order to support this and offer other options, staff will be organizing clubs and activities at lunch.

Wouldn't it be better to teach responsible use instead of banning phones? Yes, and part of that is creating boundaries. Experts agree that developing brains aren't yet equipped to self-regulate phone use in unstructured settings.

#### **In Summary**

This policy represents a cultural shift, one we believe is critical for our students' long-term well-being and success. Thank you for partnering with us to make this happen. With your support, we can provide a healthier, more focused, and more connected school environment at St. Francis Junior High.

# St. Francis is implementing a PHONE-FREE policy

Chromebooks are an ideal solution as they can be inexpensive and meet all the requirements of acceptable devices. You may want to provide a different device rather than a Chromebook.

Other acceptable devices include:

- Tablet with 9.7" screen (minimum). Ex: Apple iPad, Samsung Galaxy, Lenovo Tab, Microsoft, etc...
- Laptop with Apple OS or Windows OS. Ex: Apple, Samsung, Acer, Sony, Windows, Lenovo etc...

Devices must meet 9-7" screen requirement, have good battery life and the ability to run Google Suite for education. As always some school owned devices will be available for students to use while at school on a limited basis. We provide students with the necessary technology for their education needs. However, some students may find it easier to have access via personal Chromebooks to do their work.

Holy Spirit Catholic School Division partners with Southland Transportation Ltd. and Lethbridge School Division to provide school bus transportation services for students travelling to our Lethbridge schools.

We are currently working to implement the recent changes announced by the Government of Albera regarding eligibility, distances, and funding for September 2, 2025. For the 2025/2026 school year, the school division will not be charging transportation fees for government-funded eligible riders.

To assist with planning and ensure sufficient space on busses, riders will be REQUIRED TO REGISTER in order to access transportation services for the 2025/2026 school year. If registration is not received prior to the end of the school year, there may not be space available.

### **ELIGIBILITY & FEES**

#### Eligible - No Fee Required

The following eligible riders may access transportation for no fee:

- Kindergarten to Grade 6 students within the school division's boundaries who reside 1.6 km or more from their designated school.
- Grade 7-12 students within the school division's boundaries who reside 2 km or more from their designated school.
- Students accessing a Fine Arts Program of choice under the following circumstances:
  - K-6 students living inside the boundary of The Children of St. Martha School or Father Leonard Van Tighem School who require transportation to St. Patrick Fine Arts Elementary School.
  - Grade 7-9 students living in the Father Leonard Van Tighem School attendance zone, who attended Grade 6 at St.
     Patrick Fine Arts Elementary School in the prior school year, and wishes to continue with a Fine Arts Program of Choice by attending St. Francis Junior High School.

#### Eligible - Fee Required

Students are eligible to ride the bus for a fee under the following conditions:

• They are a Kindergarten to Grade 6 student attending Father Leonard Van Tighem School who require after-school child care at Children of St. Martha School, providing space is available on existing routes.

#### Fees for the 2025/2026 school year:

- \$25.00/month/student to a maximum of \$75.00/month/family.
- The school will assign fees to your School Cash Online Account once registration is complete

#### ADDITIONAL TRANSPORTATION NOTES:

- Transportation services are provided to school at the beginning of the school day and from school at the end of the day to the student's primary residence. Students are not permitted to ride the bus to a friend's or relative's house, daycare, parent's workplace, etc...
- The Transportation Coordinator utilizes Government approved software to calculate the distance that a student lives from their designated school. This official distance informs both eligibility and funding.
