SUBJECT: Updates to January Diploma and PAT Exams

Dear Parents and Guardians,

The Alberta Government announced changes to upcoming provincial and diploma exams on Friday, October 31, 2025. We would like to share what this means for students and families in our Division.

November 2025 Diploma Exams

November diploma exams will continue to be optional. Students may choose to write them, and schools within the Holy Spirit Catholic School Division will accommodate these requests.

Students who choose not to write the exams will still complete their courses and graduate on time, with final grades based on school-awarded marks. This decision will not affect post-secondary eligibility.

Grade 9 Provincial Achievement Tests and January 2026 Diploma Exams

The January Grade 9 Provincial Achievement Tests and the January 2026 Diploma Exams have been cancelled.

According to Alberta Education, Grade 12 students will receive their school-awarded mark as their final grade once their courses are completed this school year. A notation will be added to student transcripts confirming that no diploma exam was written. This ensures there is no impact on graduation or entry into post-secondary programs.

Future Exam Sessions

At this time, **no changes** have been announced for:

- April Diploma Exams
- June Provincial Achievement Tests or Diploma Exams

We appreciate your continued patience and understanding as we work to ensure students and families have the most accurate and up-to-date information. Further communications regarding calendar changes or other impacts on student learning will be shared in the coming days.

Canteen

School Cash Online

Holy Spirit School Division uses <u>School Cash Online</u> for the payment of all school items such as fees, canteen cards, club/athletic fees and spirit wear.

If you are new to Holy Spirit, you will need your student's ASN to register which can be found in PowerSchool. If you prefer to pay by cash or cheque you can always do so by coming into the office. (Credit and debit cards are no longer accepted.)

It provides parent and student portals which gives users access to real-time information including attendance, grades and assignment descriptions and report cards. 

In-Person DBT Skills Group for Adolescents and Parents

A six-week group for adolescents and their parents aged 13 through 17 who struggle managing emotions and behaviors. Participants must register in advance:

You will learn...

- How to become more mindful and self-aware
- Better manage feelings of anxiety and depression
- Reduce impulsive behavior & learn new coping skills
- Have healthy relationships and better communication

This six-week curriculum follows a set agenda in which new information is taught & practiced weekly, followed up with homework tasks. Skill sets include Mindfulness, Distress Tolerance, Emotional Regulation, Interpersonal Effectiveness, and Walking the Middle Path.
