

## **Grade 7 Investigative Options 2025-26**

Course: Band

Teacher: Chris Hartman

**Description:** This option is for all students who would like to learn how to play a traditional band instrument and play in an ensemble. Playing in a school band continues to be a great way to grow as a musician and to become part of a unique group of friends who support each other as you work together to make music. This is a developmental option offered during investigative option time. Once you sign up for this band class, please note that you are committing to an entire semester. This is because this option requires time and dedication in terms of consistent practice. Learning an instrument is a skill that you can take with you and enjoy all the way through grade 12 and beyond.

**Cost:** Enrolment Fee: \$50.00 This fee is to cover the cost of hiring individual clinicians who will come and work with the students at the beginning of the semester. This is very important for the students to properly begin to learn how to play the instrument that they chose. This fee also covers the method Book required at the beginning of the semester for each student. Instrument Rental: Starts at \$25.00/month This price is dependent on the instrument being rented.

**Description:** Students will be given an opportunity to read novels of their choice (2 minimum). Upon completion of a novel, students will be required to do some sort of book review as well as a number of

different activities throughout the quarter.

**Description:** The main goal of this investigative option is for students to learn different techniques and ideas for visual journaling by using words, colors, and pictures. It is more than a tool for organization and scheduling, the bullet journal can also be used to support mindfulness. Students will develop these skills while creating their own bullet journals.

**Description:** Students will work in groups to design, plan and build cardboard boat prototypes. The best

prototype will go on to represent St. Francis at the Regional boat race at the U of L.

**Course:** Crystal Jewelry Creation

Students will explore basic design techniques, learn safe and simple construction methods, and express their personal style while creating unique, wearable pieces. Along the way, they'll develop fine motor skills, patience, and confidence in their ability to turn simple materials into beautiful, finished jewelry.

Course: Film Studies

**Description:** In this film studies class you will observe, analyze, and investigate how films have shaped the way we see the world, tell stories, and reflect culture. We will be exploring directors, film techniques, and what contributes to a good film. Through watching, discussing, and creating, you will gain a new appreciation for cinema.

Course: Podcasting

**Description:** The goal of this course is to introduce students to the world of podcasting by exploring different styles and formats, analyzing what makes a podcast engaging, and learning the step-by-step process of creating one. Students will plan, write scripts, record, and share their own short podcasts while developing skills in communication, storytelling, and collaboration.

**Course:** Quilting For Beginners

**Description:** Students will learn how to sew by hand (thread a needle, knot thread, measure seams) four or six squares that we will be putting together as one large quilt. Students will be taken through the steps of backing the quilt, sewing in the quilting cotton and also how to bind it. We will then donate the quilt to an organization in Lethbridge (ie. YWCA Harbour House, etc.). Students will also have an opportunity to quilt a small pillow to be taken home.

**Description:** The primary goal of "Read It, Watch It" is to enhance literacy and engagement with literature by combining the experience of reading a book with watch its film adaptation. This approach aims to deepen understanding, foster discussion, and create a more immersive and enriching experience by allowing participants to compare and contrast the two mediums.
