# HOLY SPIRIT CATHOLIC SCHOOL DIVISION TRANSPORTATION UPDATE - 2024/2025

Holy Spirit Catholic School Division partners with Southland Transportation Ltd. and Lethbridge School Division to provide school bus transportation services for students travelling to our Lethbridge schools.

We are currently working to implement the recent changes announced by the Government of Alberta regarding eligibility, distances, and funding for September 1, 2024. For the 2024/2025 school year, the school division will not be charging transportation fees for government-funded eligible riders.

To assist with planning and ensure sufficient space on busses, riders will be **REQUIRED TO REGISTER** Before June 28, 2024 in order to access transportation services for the 2024/2025 school year.

## ELIGIBILITY AND FEES

### Eligible - No Fee Required

The following eligible riders may access transportation for no fee:

- Kindergarten to Grade 6 students within the school division's boundaries who reside 1 km or more from their designated school.
- Grade 7 to 12 students within the school division's boundaries who reside 2km or more from their designated school.
- Grade 7 to 9 students living north of Crowsnest Trail and between **1.0** and **2.0** km from St. Francis Junior High School.
- Students accessing a Fine Arts Program of Choice under the following circumstances:
  - They are a K-6 student living inside the boundary of The Children of St. Martha School or Father Leonard Van Tighem School who requires transportation to St. Patrick Fine Arts School.
  - They are a Grade 7-9 student living in the Father Leonard Van Tighem Junior High School attendance zone, who attended Grade 6 at St. Patrick Fine Arts Elementary in the prior school year, and wishes to continue with a Fine Arts Program of Choice by attending St. Francis Junior High School.

### Eligible - Fee Paying

Students are eligible to ride the bus for a fee under the following conditions:

- They are a Kindergarten to Grade 6 student attending Father Leonard Van Tighem School who require after-school child care at Children of St. Martha School, providing space is available on existing routes.

#### ***Fees for the 2024/2025 school year:***

- \$25.00/month/student to a maximum of \$75.00/month/family.
- The school will assign fees to your School Cash Online Account once registration is verified.

### **ADDITIONAL TRANSPORTATION NOTES :**

- *Transportation services are provided to school at the beginning of the school day and from school at the end of the school day to the student's primary residence. Students are not permitted to ride the bus to a friend's or relative's house, daycare, parent's workplace, etc....*
- *The Transportation Coordinator utilizes Government approved software to calculate the distance that a student lives from their designated school. This official distance informs both eligibility and funding.*

# REGISTRATION FOR TRANSPORTATION

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To assist with planning and ensure sufficient space on busses, all riders will be **REQUIRED TO REGISTER BEFORE JUNE 28, 2024** in order to access transportation services during the 2024/2025 school year.

Families of eligible students should receive an email asking them to complete an online *Transportation Registration Form* in SchoolEngage. If you don't receive an email, please contact your child's school directly to confirm your eligibility and arrange for a form to be assigned to you.

## To access your SchoolEngage Account:

### ***For Current Families who already have access to PowerSchool***

1. Log into PowerSchool. If you need help logging into PowerSchool, please contact your child's school directly.
2. Once you are logged in, click on the "School Engage" option on the bottom left corner of the screen.
3. Select the "Student" tab on the top-left side of the screen. Then select the name of the student you are registering for transportation services.
4. The *Transportation Registration Forms* will appear under the Forms section. Select the "Open" button next to the appropriate form.
5. Complete and submit the form.

### ***For New Families who don't yet have access to PowerSchool:***

1. Log into School Engage using the email address and password that you created when you registered your child in our system.
2. Select the Student tab on the top-left side of the screen, then select the name of the student you are wishing to register for transportation services.
3. The Transportation Registration Forms will appear under the Forms section. Select the "Open" button next to the appropriate form.
4. Complete and submit the form.

Completed *Transportation Registration Forms* will be reviewed and verified. Once verified, a confirmation notice will be sent.

The school division is committed to providing transportation to students who register for service before **June 28, 2024**. Please be aware that, riders who do NOT register by **June 30, 2024** will NOT be eligible to receive bus service in the 2024/2025 school year.

Bus route information for the upcoming school year is expected to be available in mid to late August and may be found on Southland's Lethbridge webpage at:

Families will also have the opportunity to use Southland Transportation Ltd.'s GPS tracking service app, "MyBusStop," which provides real-time information about bus location, route stops, schedules, and possible delays. ## Bl. Pier Giorgio Frassati 1901-1925 (Feast Day: July 4)

Pier Giorgio Frassati was born into a wealthy and influential Italian family in 1901, and from an early age was dedicated to the Eucharist and the Rosary—despite his parents' rejection of religion. He spoke willingly and frequently with both friend and stranger about his spiritual life, and at the age of 17 joined the Society of St. Vincent de Paul. He dedicated most of his time to serving the sick, needy, and orphaned of Turin—although he did this largely in secret. In particular, he was keen to spread the Catholic Social Teachings at the time, particularly those promoted in *Rerum Novarum*. He was handsome and a good athlete, with mountain climbing as his favourite sport, and was known as a prankster as well.

## Build! Pilgrims of Hope

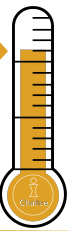


Shortly before he was to graduate from university, he contracted polio and died almost immediately. At his funeral, the family was surprised to see the church and streets flooded with those whom he had quietly served; and those in attendance were also surprised that he was part of this influential and wealthy family. At his beatification in 1990, Pope John Paul II called him the "Man of the Eight Beatitudes." One of his last notes to a friend prior to his death was a short one on the back of a picture of himself climbing. It says simply "Verso l'alto"—"To the Heights", which has become representative of his own striving to reach God and eternal life, and a motto for others who are doing likewise.

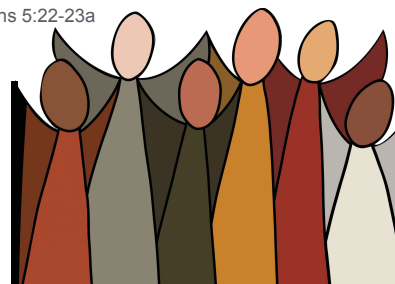

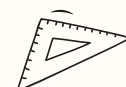

## What is Off Campus Programming?

It is a way for students to earn high school credit away from campus through five different programs.

# OFF CAMPUS PROGRAMS

### Work Experience

#### Work Experience

The WEP is an opportunity for students to develop employability skills while completing high school credits. Students work at an approved work site part time or during the summer.

Students work with employers and receive one credit for every 25 hours of work. Students may work any day, Monday through Sunday. Transportation is the students' responsibility.

#### Dual Credit

Holy Spirit students have an opportunity to earn post secondary credit as well as high school credit by enrolling into one of the many offered post secondary dual credit courses.

### RAP

#### Registered Apprenticeship Program

RAP is an opportunity for high school students to earn up to 40 credits towards their high school diploma while counting hours towards their first year apprenticeship in one of Alberta's trades.

The students who have made career choices and commitments to RAP begin their training in any one of the apprenticeship trades while in high school. They spend part of the year in school completing graduation requirements and part in industry as a registered apprentice.

### Special Projects

### Green Certificate

#### Green Certificate

The Green Certificate Program is an apprenticeship - style program that allows students, who live and work in agriculture, the opportunity to earn credits toward their high school diploma.

Students will have the opportunity to obtain an industry recognized certificate from Alberta Agriculture. Students learn on the job, under the direction of experienced farm personnel and under the supervision and administration of Alberta Agriculture, Forestry (AF), and Alberta Education.

#### Special Projects

Special Project students become involved in supervised selection, planning, and organization of their own programs which is NOT within the scope of the regular curriculum. Students can earn up to 15 credits.

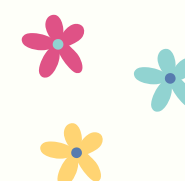

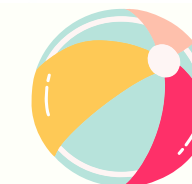
